Old Business

Reform Update Deadline for entries in the naming contest for Entity 43 is May 6th with a name being chosen by May 9th, 2022. The governance model for Entity 43 has been chosen and will be a Village. Under that model the village will responsible for delivery of all services except for roads for the former LSDs and /or portions of LSDs that have been annexed. The village must also make by-laws respecting police protection as outlined in the Local Government Act; 10(3) and 10(4).

The Village of Petitcodiac Rural Plan By-law, being By-law Number 60 enacted on August 29, 2018 and filed in the Westmorland County Registry Office as number 38461241 on October 5, 2018, is hereby amended as follows:

- 1) Section 4.4.1 a), being the Industrial Zone Permitted Main Use list, is amended by adding the following use in sequential order:

(ix) an existing residential use
