## **Business Arising from the Minutes**

## **New Business**

**Public Hearing re: rezoning PID 814160, 70076948 and 70654058** Council received notification that pursuant to section 52 of the Community Planning Act, that the Minister of Local Government and Local Governance Reform is considering the

following amendment to the Westmorland-Albert Planning Area Rural Plan Regulation – Community Planning Act:

To rezone PID 00814160, 70076948 and 70654058 on Route 890 from the Agriculture – A Zone to Intensive Resource Development – IRD Zone for the purpose of a gypsum quarry.

A Public Hearing has been set for Tuesday, November 15, 2022 at 6:30 pm at the Maritime Motorsports Hall of Fame, 5 Hooper Lane, Petitcodiac, NB.

**Maple Park – Renaming Community Garden** Mayor Pollock expressed to Council that he would like to see the Village re-name the Community Garden. They had no issues with that proposal. He will pursue more information and will come back to Council with potential names at a future meeting.

**Glass Recycling** Mayor Pollock reported the village will be receiving a receptacle for glass that will be placed near the village garage at 7 Wheaton Road.

**Update on Policing Services** – Council received a letter from Ryan Donaghy of Local Government indicating that restructured entities under the current municipal reform process will see no change to the current provincial policing services model for the 2023 calendar year. However restructured entities with former local governments and local service districts will assume the cost of policing for the entire entity, as they will be levying property taxes in those former local governments and LSDs. The invoice process will be established in the coming months.
